- 5. Planned length of the workshop (e.g., half day, full day)
- 6. A tentative schedule showing all planned activities (paper sessions, panels, keynote addresses, etc.)
- 7. Expected number of submissions and acceptance rate
- 8. Expected number of attendees
- 9. Program chair(s), and, optionally, tentative Technical Program Committee
- 10. Short professional biographies of workshop organizers
- 11. A description of the publicity plans
- 12. If applicable, descriptions of the past instances of the workshop, including dates, organizers, submission counts, acceptance counts, attendance counts, and web sites (URLs).
