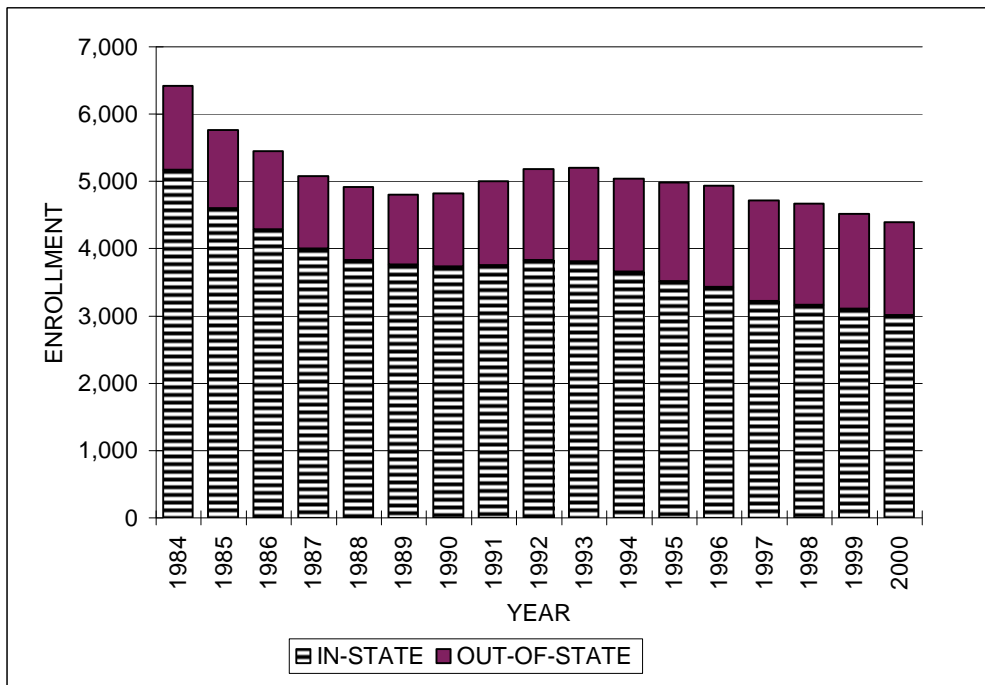

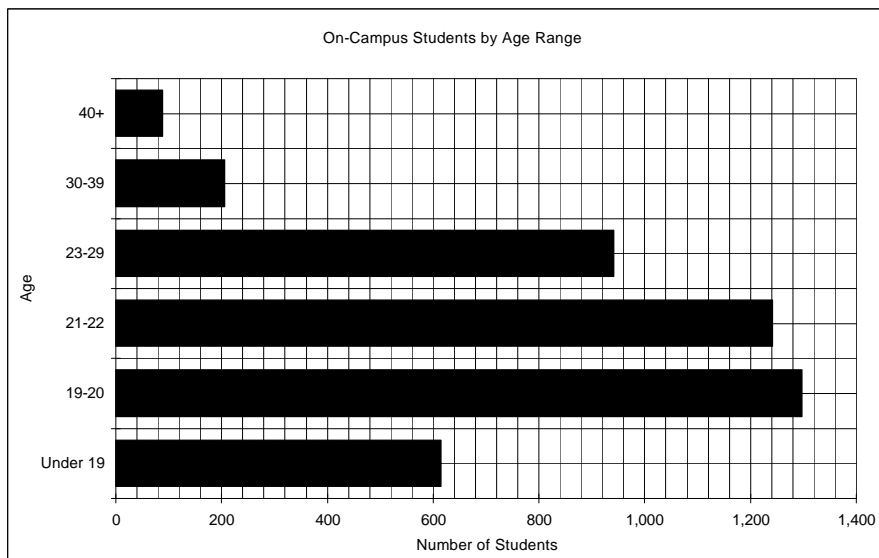

# **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES CENTER**

The Center offers UMR students and alumni a variety of services to help them prepare for professional employment. Assistance is available in organizing a job search, developing an effective resume and cover letter, and acquiring effective interview techniques. Employers from business, industry, and government agencies interview students for summer, co-op, and full-time employment and request resume referrals.

## **1999/00 Full-time, Summer and Co-op Employment**

- 482 companies interviewed on campus for full-time, co-op, and summer employment
- 6,267 student interviews conducted for full-time, summer and co-op employment
- 34,250 full-time, summer, and co-op resumes were referred to requesting companies
- 468 students in co-op program in 111 cities and 31 states
- 2 Career Fairs attended by 351 companies and over 3,500 students
- 28 Workshops and 6 Orientations were presented
- Over 800 individual appointments and 79 practice interviews were conducted

## **1999/00 Alumni Services**

- 5,560 alumni resumes referred to 372 requesting companies
- 125 alumni registered for resume referrals and internet access to UMR job listings
