
Math 204, Exam 2 November 4, 2008








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Use variation of parameters to find the general solution of $y''+3y'+2y=1/(1+e^{x})$.










Use the definition of the Laplace transform to find the Laplace transform of f, where f(t)=1 for $0 \le t < 1$ and f(t)=1 for $t \ge 1$.








Use Laplace transforms to solve $y'+6y=e^{4t}$, y(0)=2.







Problem 4, part (a)

A 4-pound weight stretches a spring 2 feet. The weight is released from rest 18 inches above the equilibrium position, and the resulting motion takes place in a medium offering a damping force numerically equal to 7/8 times the instantaneous velocity. Formulate an IVP that serves to find the equation of motion.



Problem 4, part (b)

Use Laplace transforms to solve the IVP from (a).



Find the general solution of $x^2y''-2y=0$.
